

306. ADVANCE PAYMENT OF £300 - SECTION 42A OF THE DEFENCE FORCES RETIREMENT BENEFITS ACT 1948 - 1962

- 1. The following instruction is based on AHQ 52/R12/4(PS1) of 13 Aug 63.
- 2. The conditions of eligibility for the advance payment of graturity of £300 under Section 42A of the DFRB Act 1948 1962 have been revised.
- 3. The revised position is that any member who, after 14 December, 1959, completes 6 years service for pension under an initial engagement, irrespective of the period of engagement, and who subsequently re-engages or agrees to re-engage for further service, making a total in all of at least 12 years, may be regarded as eligible for payment of the amount of £300.
- 4. The time when a member should normally become entitled to the payment is as under:
 - a. ARA enlistee for 6 years. Upon completion of the initial engagement of 6 years provided he then reengages for 6 years.

b. Army Apprentice enlistee

- (1) Tradesman. Upon completion of the initial engagement of 9 years provided he re-engages for 3 or 6 years; or, at the 6 year point of the initial engagement provided he has then re-engaged in advance for a further 3 or 6 years.
- (2) Musician or clerk. Upon completion of the initial engagement of 8 or 7½ years as appropriate provided he re-engages for 6 years; or, at the 6 year point of the initial engagement provided he has then re-engaged in advance for a further 6 years.
- As soon as a member becomes eligible for the payment of £300 he must complete either an application for the payment (DFRB Form 9B) or an election not to receive the payment (DFRB Form 112). Stocks of DFRB Form 9B are held by this Headquarters andwill be made aval on request. It is important to note that applications should be made on official DFRB Form 9B and not on a roneod proforma. DFRB Form 112 is shown at Annex A to MBI 90 6.

- 6. The conditions have retrospective effect. Therefore, any member who was ineligible but now meets the requirements the revised conditions should submit through normal channels ther an application for the payment (DFRB Form 9B) or an election not to receive the payment (DFRB From 112). Members who were eligible previously but elected not to receive the payment have no new rights.
- 7. Some examples of the operation of elegibility are listed below.
- 8. A re-write of MBI 90 6 may be ahticipated.

Examples of Eligibility

ARA enlistees for 6 years

- No. 1 Enlisted for 6 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages for 6 years on 1 Aug 65.

 Eligible for the advance on 1 Aug 65 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.
- No. 2 Enlisted for 6 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages for 3 years on 1 Aug 65.

 Re-engages for 3 years or 6 years on 1 Aug 68.

 Eligible for the advance on 1 Aug 68 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.
- No. 3 Enlisted for 6 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages in advance for 6 years at any time prior to 1 Aug 65.

 Eligible for the advance on 1 Aug 65 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.
- No. 4 Enlisted for 6 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages in advance for 3 years at any time prior to 1 Aug 65.

 Later re-engages in advance prior to 1 Aug 68 or re-engages on 1 Aug 68 for a further 3 or 6 years.

 Becomes eligible for the advance in the first instance on the date of the last re-engagement in advance but not earlier than 1 Aug 65 or in the second instance on 1 Aug 68. DFRB Form 9B or 112 should be completed immediately after date of becoming eligible.

Army Apprentice Enlistees

- No. 5 Enlisted for 9 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages for 3 or 6 years on 1 Aug 68.

 Eligible for the advance on 1 Aug 68 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.
- No. 6 Enlisted for 9 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages in advance for 3 or 6 years at any time prior to 1 Aug 68.

 Becomes eligible for the advance on date re-engages in advance but not earlier than 1 Aug 65.

 DFRB Form 9B or 112 should be completed immediately after date of becoming eligible.
- No. 7 Enlisted for 8 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages for 6 years on 1 Aug 67.

 Eligible for advance on 1 Aug 67 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.

- No. 8 Enlisted for 8 years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages in advance for 6 years at any time prior to 1 Aug 67.

 Becomes eligible for the advance on date re-engages in advance but not earlier than 1 Aug 65. DFRB Form 9B or 112 should be completed immediately after date of becoming eligible.
- No. 9 Enlisted for $7\frac{1}{2}$ years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages for 6 years on 1 Feb 67.

 Eligible for the advance on 1 Feb 67 and immediately should complete DFRB Form 9B or 112.
- No. 10 Enlisted for 7½ years on 1 Aug 59.

 Re-engages in advance for 6 years at any time prior to 1 Feb 67.

 Becomes eligible for the advance on date re-engages in advance but not earlier than 1 Aug 65. DFRB From 9B of 112 should be completed immediately after date of becoming eligible.
- No. 11 In the case of a member enlisted as an Army apprentice but that engagement is subsequently terminated during the apprentice training period and he continues without break in continuity of service on a new engagement of at least 6 years, for the purposes of the advance payment, service for pension will be deemed to have commenced from the date of the new engagement.

307. STATUTORY DECLARATION

- 1. Members are reminded that before leaving MALAYA on RTA, they will be required to complete a Statutory Declaration to the effect that they have NO civil debts remaining unpaid in this theatre.
- 2. If this Statutory Declaration is filled in untruthfully, then the member lays himself open to severe penalities.
- 3. Therefore with two paydays to go after this one, all members should make very strong efforts to settle any debts outstanding.

General

- 1. 103 Fd Bty RAA will handover to 102 Fd Bty RAA during the period 21 Oct 4 Nov 63. This handover will include the following:
 - a. Ordnance stores and transport stores.
 - b. Barrack stores.
 - c. Engineer buildings and fittings.
 - d. Battery property.
 - e. Battery and public monies.
 - f. Orderly room files and documents.
 - g. Secret files and correspondence.

Ordnance Stores and Transport Stores

- 2. A 100% stocktake of stores on charge to the battery will be held with cut off date as at 0730 hrs 19 Oct 63. The result of this stocktake will form the basis of the transfer of all stores from 103 Bty to 102 Bty.
- 3. A Stocktaking Officer will be appointed by each Battery Commander. The stocktake will be carried out in accordance with the provisions of reference A.
- 4. The stocktake will be by location and each sub-account and inventory will be a separate stocktake, which after completion will be consolidated by the Stocktaking Officer.
- 5. The count for all sub-accounts will commence at 0800 hrs 21 Oct 63.
- 6. All documentation will be completed and handed to the Stocktaking Officer by 1230 hrs 26 Oct 63.
- 7. A representative from each battery will be required for each sub-account. This will enable the representative from 102 Bty to assume responsibility for stores as soon as the stocktake of this location is completed.

8. The following personnel are appointed as stocktaking representatives at the locations shown:-

9. It is the sub-account holders responsibility to provide at the stocktake ALL stores in their possession. It is NOT the Stocktaking Officers task to find them. The question of NOT on ledger charge does NOT arise as stores surplus in one sub-account are probably deficient elsewhere.

10. Action by Sub-account Holders Prior to 29 Oct 63

- a. Ensure that a 100% check between sub-account ledgers and Bty master ledger is conducted.
- b. Ensure all log books and discrepancy cards are up to date and have been checked.
- c. Prepare three copies of stock sheets showing the numericlature of stores held by the sub-account Stock Sheets will be provided by BOMS.
- d. Prepare list in triplicate showing stores bearing registered numbers.
- e. Procure copies of CES from BOMS for any set stores held.

11. Movement of Stores.

NO movement of stores between sub-accounts or Q Store will take place between 21 Oct - 4 Nov 63 inclusive.

12. Action by Sub-Account Holders at Stocktake.

- a. 103 Bty sub-account representative will produce stores to 102 Bty representative. It will be necessary for all cupboards, drawers etc to be open for inspection, and sub-account holders will ensure that all keys are availabale.
- b. In the case of transport the following action will be taken:-
 - (1) All vehicles will be grounded for the period of the count.
 - (2) All CES items will be laid out in front of the vehicle and drivers will be present.
- c. The 102 Bty representative will:-
 - (1) Count all stores and record the result on his copy of the working stock sheet.
 - (2) Check and record registered numbers of stores.
 - (3) At the conclusion of the count reconcile working stock sheets for stores:-

"In Store"

"On Issue"

"Total in Store and On Issue"

Transcribe all totals to the number three copy of the stock sheets and sign certificate at the foot of each of the three sets of stock sheets.

(4) Recount and reach agreement in the case of discrepancies between the three sets of stock sheets.

- (5) Leaving three vacant lines rule off sub-account ledgers in red ink. Enter the stock figure in the ledger below the ruled off line. This stock figure in the "Total in store and on issue" taken from the stock sheets, and is not necessar ily the old ledger figure. Also under this cut off place the words "STOCKTAKE" and the date and initials of the stocktaking officer.
- (6) Check 100%
 - (a) Entry of stock figure on ledger.
 - (b) Entry of ledger balance on stock sheets.
 - (c) Castings of excesses and deficiencies on stock sheets.
- d. The 103 Bty representative will verify the count in para 12 c (1) and record the figure on his copy of the working stock sheet.
 - e. The 103 Bty representative will check all detail of 102 Bty representatives action vide paragraphs 12 c (2) to (6).

13. Action by Sub-Account Holder After Count of Stock

- a. Prepare AAF F46 in accordance with reference A to para 600 if required.
- b. Check 100% AAF F46 with stock sheets.
- c. Return sub-account ledger to BOMS for check.
- d. Hand following to 103 Bty stocktaking officer.
 Completed stock sheets (3 copies) including lists of registered numbers and supporting documents.
- 14. The 102 Bty representative is responsible that the count is accurate and at this stage assumes responsibility for the safe custody of stores counted by him and the 103 Bty representative.

15. Action by BQMS Prior to 19 Oct 63

- a. Prepare four copies of stock sheets showing ALL stores on charge including loan stores and Barrack Stores.
- b. Prepare summaries of unit equipment on issue to personnel on loan, or at LAD or Workshops which can NOT be counted physically by the stock taking officer.
- c. Take action to ensure the Bty Ledger balances are checked 100% against the master ledger for all stores and that there are NO outstanding transactions.
- d. Prepare lists in Quadriplicate showing stores bearing registered numbers.
- e. Prepare copies of CES for set stores for inclusion in the working stock sheets.
- f. Prepare all store rooms and marquee to enable ease of identification and count of stores.
- g. Ensure that all temporary issues such as day book issues are returned to store.

16. Action By Stocktaking Officers During the Stock Count

- a. Stocktaking officers from 103 Bty and 102 Bty will cou ALL stores held by BQMS in storerooms and count ALL stores held by BQMS in storerooms and store compounds. On the completion of the physical check the summarised figure of stores on issue will be entered on the stock sheets from the following records:-
 - (1) Results of stocktake by sub-accounts.
 - (2) AAF F12 Issues to personnel.
 - (3) Stores on loam to other units.
 - (4) Stores at LAD or Workshops.

- c. Check in detail with CES all stores held by the BQMS which are covered complete Equipment schedules and list an deficiencies.

17. Action by Stocktaking Officers After Count of Stock

- a. After completion of extensions on stock sheets, rule off unit ledgers in red ink leaving three lines after the last entry in ledger folios. Under the line endorse the word "STOCKTAKE" and date.
- b. Enter stock figure in ledger and initial the entry.
- c. Check 100% the following.
 - (1) Entry of stock figure on ledger (Para 17b)
 - (2) Entry of ledger balances on stock sheets (Para 17a)
- d. Prepare AAF F46s in accordance with reference A para 600.
- e. Prepare stocktake adjusting vouchers as directed by HQ AUST Army Force.
- f. Take action for adjustment of discrepancies vide reference A Para 616.

18. Action by Bty Headquarters on Completion of Stocktake

- a. In accordance with the provisions of Reference A Para 616.
- 19. Action by BOMS on Completion of Stocktake.
 - a. Transfer store account to 102 Fd Bty RAA.
 - b. Complete transactions necessary to issue stores to new subaccounts of 402 Bty, the sub-accounts stock sheets will be used for this purpose.

Barrack Stores

- 20. Capt P J BADCOE will hand over Barrack Stores to Capt G FITZGENALD beginning 0830 hrs 23 Oct 63.
- 21. Procedure will be as follows:
 - a. BQMS will prepare new original and duplicate copies of inventories from existing 103 Bty inventories.

- b. At each location at the time set out below the stocktaking representatives will physically check all stores on location noting on each copy of the inventories any excesses or deficiencies.

TRAINING REPORT - NOVEMBER 1963

General

- 1. This is the final Training Report for 105 Pd Bty RAA during its service in MALAYA.

Training General

3. 45 Regt RA Practice Camp. Practice Camp was held from 1 - 10 Oct. 103 Bty provided safety parties and the enemy.

4. Fixation Trial.

- as By order of DRA (War Office) a fixation trial was held on 7 Oct to determine how accurately GPOs and OPOs can fix their own positions and targets. A similar trial was carried out in BAOR.
- b. The GPOs from each battery fixed their battery centres and all OP parties in the Regt each fixed 9 OPs and a total of 27 targets.
