9. Coral – a Timely Reminder:

(I apologise in advance for including two separate articles about Coral in this Bulletin. Your committee has always tried to avoid being too "Coral-centric". We recognise that many of our members who were not at Coral, experienced action and acquitted themselves bravely in a multitude of other clashes and it would not be balanced for us to concentrate too much on Coral. Please forgive us this time as both these items needed to be said.)

Many articles, books and memoirs have been written, and lectures given, about what happened at FSB Coral that night. Plenty of emphasis is rightly given to the roles of the mortar platoon and the gunners of 102 Battery. However, from time to time, these "recollections" do not always recognise the huge role played by our own HQ Battery. Remember that the gunners of HQ Battery took the full brunt of the NVA sweep through our lines, and of the two 12 Field Regiment gunners who were killed-in-action within the FSB perimeter, both were in HQ Battery, as was the gunner most seriously wounded – shot 5 times during the course of the night.

It was all a long time ago, but it is important to the memory of our KIAs and the blokes who fought beside them, that we strive to give HQ Battery the recognition that they thoroughly deserve. So next time you and your mates get together to relive those times, don't overlook the other heroes – the gunners of HQ Battery.
