Good Morning Ladies and Gentlemen,

Now that the winter chills are nearly behind us we will be able to get out of bed without so many aches and pains hopefully.

We would like to thank the people who responded to our request for information on the personnel who were at F.S.B. Coral / Balmoral. The information derived from this exercise has been nothing short of fantastic. I would dare to say we are nearing full numbers on the parts of the Regiment involved. We are still missing addresses on many, and these names will be outlined on the base of this letter in order of units in which they served. We hope you can help us further in this regard.

Your executive has worked hard to get these details for the Coral / Balmoral committee, and as promised earlier, no funding is to be forthcoming from our Association for that given Anniversary. We are doing this work in KIND to the point that our committee paid for the postage on the last mail out until funding is forthcoming from the D.V.A. or private sponsorship. On that note we would like to point out that D.V.A. funding will not be as large as first thought as this event will cost in excess of \$400,000.00 to hold for all units involved. We do not see a snowballs chance in hell of that figure being granted. We would also see a need to gain private sponsorship to cover some of the shortfall. But even given that, there will still be a large shortfall. So at the moment, we do see that we will have to pay our own accommodation and transport to and from the celebrations in Canberra.
