1. Correction:

3. Changes to Great Southern Railway Offers:

President Flood also wants our train-travelling members to be aware of recent changes to the benefits funded by the government to Vietnam Vets and their Carers. Please note the following from the TPI Association via the Victorian VVAA.

Advice has been received through the TPI Association that Great Southern Rail is in the process of being sold by its UK based owners, Serco Group plc, to Australian owned Allegro Funds. The business of Great Southern Rail will continue to be developed with the change of ownership and specifically, no change to the entitlements of concession holders, including TPI's, will result from the change in ownership

Also of note is the statement in the 2014 Federal Budget announcing that the funding for concessions on Great Southern Rail journeys will cease from 1 July 2016. This impact of the cessation of this concession beyond that date is still being assessed. All relevant stakeholders will be advised of the outcome once the impact for concession holders has been determined.

The TPI Association have further advised that this issue will be discussed at its next Committee meeting – more to follow! Hint - those planning to travel via Great Southern Rail to either Perth or Darwin may well need to do so before 1st July 2016. Peter Bright, Secretary VVAA Victorian Branch

9. Membership Fees:

The result is that all members previously recorded as "Perpetual", were re-classified as Ordinary Members and assigned a 10-year term rather than considered to be in perpetuity.

As a result of this, the first group of ex-perpetual members, that is those who paid their \$100 fee before 31st August 2006, will have their 10-year terms begin to expire from 1st September next year (2016). You will all receive notification of this at the time. The remainder of ex-perpetual members will expire in 2017 or later.

10. Citation Awarded to Australian Units, Vietnam 1965 and 1966:

We are aware that some members who have seen bits and pieces relating to this award are concerned about the inaccuracy in describing the units involved. Flood has provided this explanation:

Some of you may be aware that the Governor-General recently approved the awarding of the **REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM CROSS OF GALLANTRY WITH PALM UNIT CITATION** to those Australian units that served under the command of the US 173rd Airborne Brigade SVN 5 May 1965 – 31 May 1966.

One of the units listed is: Battery Section, 4th Field Regiment LAD RAEME (and re-designated in country to 105th Field Battery 12th Field Regiment LAD RAEME)

This entry is an historical error. How it occurred, who knows, but steps are being taken to amend reference to "12th Field Regiment LAD RAEME".
