Recollections of Vietnam whilst a Platoon Commander of 8 RAR

I recall a story, related to our Salvation Army representative [Jim Macintyre] which goes along the lines of - he had a soldier escort allocated to him, a boy who had been in one of the rifle companies, in one of the forward elements of the battalion, and had been in a few nasty spots and was a bit shell-shocked. We send him back and he can do jobs such as, in this case being the escort driver/assistant for the Sally-man. And a lot of blokes would have thoroughly enjoyed that, and it would have been a good break for some of them too, you would think. But, what apparently happened was that, as was his want, the Salvation Army man used to go all over the action, God bless him, and he'd be going along in his Land Rover or come in on the helicopter and have his little soldier-assistant running along helping him carry the tea urn, and he'd have his rifle slung over his back, and all that sort of stuff.

And driving about, and on one occasion, when the Salvation Army representative had to go from the base out to one of the very forward areas, he chose to drive; perhaps he couldn't get a helicopter, and so he packed his tea urn, and his biscuits, and whatever on, into the back of his land rover, and got his driver to hop in, and drive.
