3. Yungaburra Memorial to Veterans of the Afghanistan Conflict:

The following moving report is from member Steve Lewis:

"In the 44 years since I returned from active service in South Vietnam, I have had occasion to attend many memorial services, perhaps none more poignant or moving than the 1987 welcome home parade through the streets of Sydney. On that occasion I recall an ageing WWII veteran in the crowd, a chest full of campaign medals and one sleeve pinned as he had no arm with which to fill it. As I passed this man he reached out with his one arm and said "thankyou", and I am not ashamed to say that from that point in the march, tears streamed from my eyes, perhaps made less visible by the fact that I fortuitously had chosen to wear sunglasses for the parade. Until recently, no other service has made quite the same impact on me since.

On Saturday June 22nd, I was holidaying in far north Queensland and had the honour of attending a very special service where a memorial dedicated to veterans of the Afghanistan conflict was to be consecrated. Named The Avenue of Honour, it placed particular emphasis on the 39 soldiers who had paid the supreme sacrifice, honouring each with a flame tree which flanked a pathway overlooking a magnificent park and lake setting on the banks of Lake Tinaroo.

The ceremony began with a skydiver carrying a huge Australian flag leaving a fixed wing aircraft and descending to the amplified music of Dire Straits playing their memorable anthem, Brothers In Arms. The tune sparked spontaneous applause from the crowd, estimated at over 2,000.

This is the first official memorial to veterans of the Afghanistan conflict and the occasion has significance in as much as the entire project has been driven by the parents of a soldier killed on active service in Afghanistan. With only community and local government help, the Chuck family have created a glorious and contemporary point of remembrance for all to share. In spite of non-federal government involvement in the construction of the memorial, the (then) Prime Minister Julia Gillard and Opposition Leader Tony Abbott were present at the ceremony, along with many notable national and local dignitaries including the Chief of the Defence Force and the Chief of the Army.

Perhaps one of the more poignant moments was listening to a senior Army officer reading the list of the 39, stating rank, name, unit and date of death. On several occasions he had to pause, his breathing audible as he composed himself to complete the task at hand. Undoubtedly he was aware of the fact that yet another tree would soon be added to the 39, making his job that much harder.

Equally poignant was the presence of relatives of the 39 men who were invited to place roses at the base of the memorial. My enduring memory of that part of the ceremony was the tender age of our soldiers' widows. May we have no more."
