9. Welfare Officers Report - 8th December 20:

Lady Members and Gentlemen Gunners.

This will be my final report this year and a great opportunity to wish all a very Happy Xmas from the Welfare Department!

I have had some telephone calls with Ross Alexander (HQ Bty 1968) over the past few weeks about Prostate Cancer and the importance of guys our age, having our prostate regularly checked.

Ross has recently had a prostate operation and is currently completing a six-week course of daily radiation.

Ross tells me that although the radiation makes him very tired, he is fine.

However, Ross mentioned to me, that I should remind all our guys, of the importance of having our prostate regularly checked, both PSA (blood) and digital, at least on a twelve month basis and where there may be a history of this disease, perhaps on a sixmonthly basis.

Ross was having regular tests, but a sudden rise in his PSA level, signaled a problem and resulted in an early detection.

With no knowledge on anything medical, I looked up prostate cancer in the internet, and it shows other symptoms as well. These include:

- needing to urinate more frequently, often during the night
- needing to rush to the toilet
- difficulty in starting to urinate (hesitancy)
- straining or taking a long time while urinating
- a weak flow while urinating and feeling that your bladder is not completely empty once you have urinated.

Thanks Ross for your suggestion to mention this disease, which I know, has visited a number of our Regiment guys. Good luck to you too mate, as you complete your treatment.

I spoke to **Russell Hogan (102 Bty 1968-69)** today, who I know has been bravely battling with prostate worries.

Russell never ever complains about anything and is always concerned about the welfare of his fellow gunners, but I know he is suffering and I know how well all those who know him, respect him.

He tells me he is enjoying training a couple of good race horses (Mortar Man and Benny's Jet) and is having quite a bit of success with both nags.

Russell recently disturbed two robbers who were endeavoring to remove some of Russell's gear from his shed. Whilst the police were dealing with one of the robbers who was trying to get away, Russell cornered the other would-be thief and managed to rearrange the thief's face before almost flattening a pain-clothed policeman who was coming to arrest the thief. Fortunately, Russell did not hang one on the police officer and both robbers were arrested.

Russell is off for more oncology treatments on Tuesday, so "good luck Punchy Hoges".
