Sadly, over the last month, we lost two valued members of the Regiment's two Vietnam tours. Details will follow later in the bulletin. As most of you know, the Museum at North Head has closed. The Sydney Harbour Trust increased the rent to an impossible level for it to survive. The work was voluntary and the many long hours of the dedicated men preserving the history of the old Fort seems to have gone forever. The memorial walk was coming on really well and it was a pleasure to walk and find the names of the men who served, many from previous conflicts who are no longer with us. Funding for this walk came from sponsors, ex-servicemen and families who paid for their personal paver to be placed on the walk. Now the Gates are shut, nobody can appreciate it and who knows the future of this prime real estate? Kevin ("Scrimmy") Ruel Scrimshaw 2192256 born 8/02/1946, 64, served 2 tours 28/05/68 - 9/05/69; 2/06/71 - 17/12/71 with 104 Battery as a Bombardier on the guns and again as an FO assistant with Charlie Company 4 RAR/NZ. Kevin was a regular soldier for 6 years. I am reliably told that Kevin topped his class beating Officers in his FO training course.

On the 1st of February 2011 former Warrant Officer Class One Arthur "the angry ant" Richard Cox 22093 passed away.

Arthur Cox was born 11.7.1928 in Mortdale N.S.W. and enlisted in the Australian Regular Army on the 5.4.1948. B.K. (Battery Captain) Don Tait described Arthur as "an old mate" who will be irreplaceable. He served in Vietnam from 3/3/1968 - 4/2/1969.

On behalf of the members of that 102 Battery tour of Vietnam, Don said that he is deeply saddened that "one of us" will no longer be able to parade. He retired as an RSM after serving 35 years in the Army and retired at the age of 55 on the 9.7. 1983. During his time in the Army, Arthur was awarded the Long Service Medal, the Good Conduct Medal and the Meritorious Medal.

We have received a request for assistance with a book which is being written about the 521 lost in Vietnam.

The 521 Fallen Australians - Vietnam Research by Barry Hampson

There are 521 Australian Service personnel recorded on the Australian War Memorial Honour Roll as having lost their lives as a result of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam Conflict, arguably in Australia's most contentious conflict.

Each of these 521 Australians has a story that needs to be recorded, *before it is too late*, their lives before they entered the military, their military service and how they lost *(their sacrifice)* their lives. Coupled with their story, is the story of how their death effected and continues to affect their families, friends and the mates they served with, which also needs to be recorded.

I have started researching each of "The 521" to produce a book honouring and documenting their lives, how each touched those around them, how they lost their life and the affect that their loss on their family, friends and the mates they served with.

My reason for writing this book is because I want to ensure that current and future generations remember them, remember the sacrifice they made and how their loss effected and continue to affect their families, friends and the mates they served with.

Additionally, as part of my research for my book I am trying to visit the final resting places of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice in the Vietnam Conflict; to place a flag and poppy at their final resting place as a mark of respect.

To assist me in this endeavour I would like to talk to and interview anyone who served with any of the 521 Australians; this includes members of their families and friends. Anyone interviewed will be asked to elect whether they are happy to be quoted as a source of information in the book or remain totally anonymous.

A bit about myself, I have a military background having enlisted in the Australian Regular Army in 1980, as a Private, serving 23 plus year and working my way through the ranks. When I enlisted in the Army the majority of my Corporals, Sergeants, etc were Vietnam Veterans. Additionally, my father is a Vietnam Veteran having served with 1st Battalion Group in 1965-66; as such I hold those who have served in Vietnam with the utmost respect. For myself, I have served overseas in the Middle East and East Timor.
